

Sample Survey for District Advisory Council 11-19-15

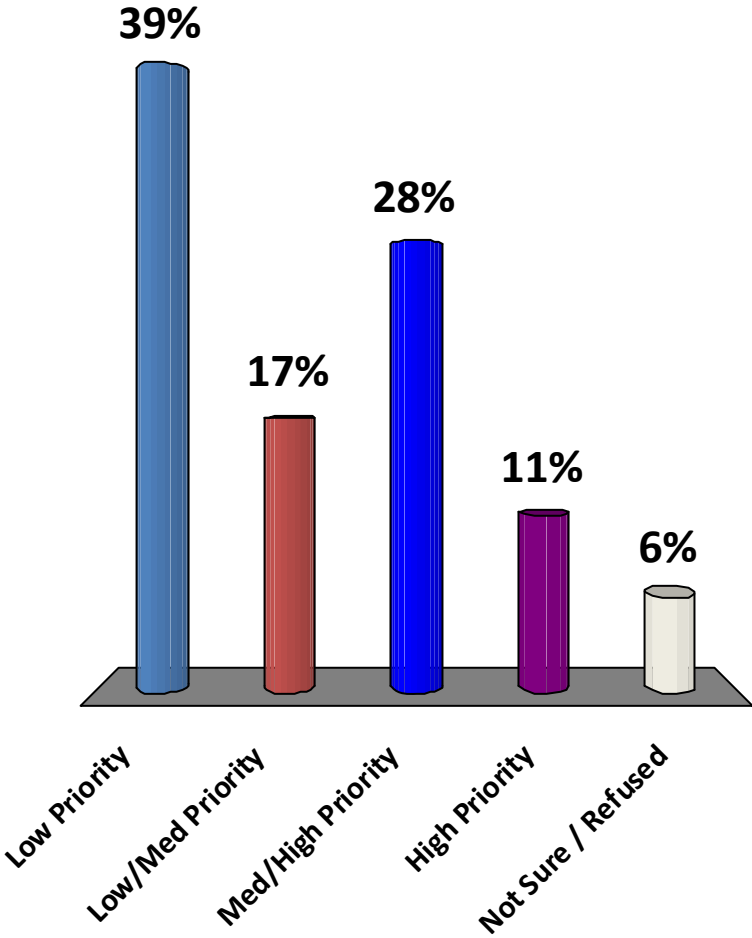

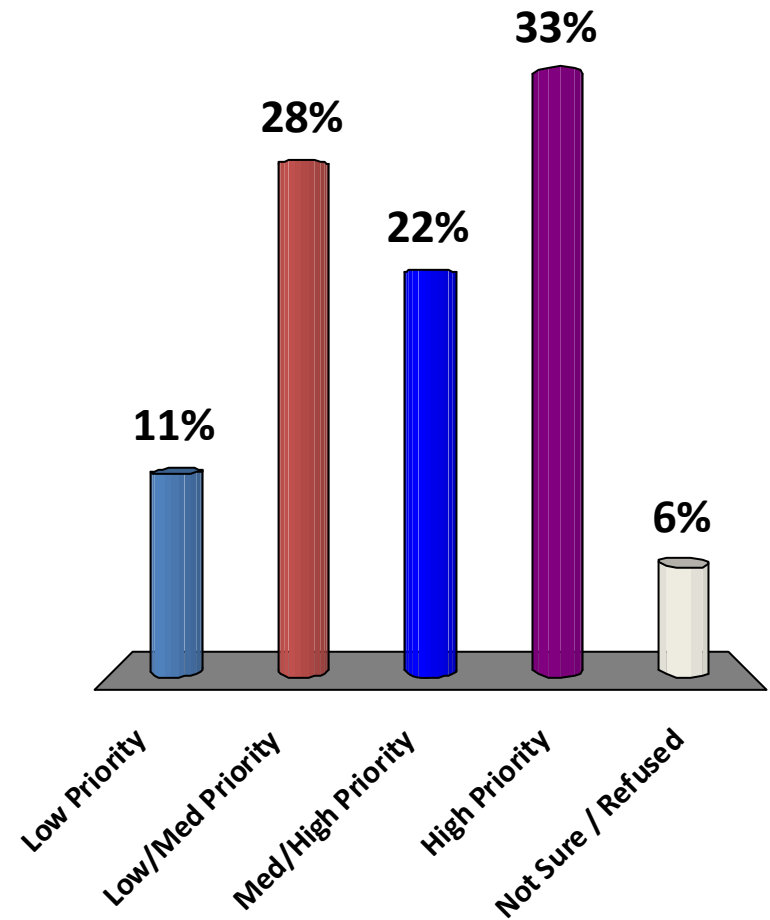
1. Preserve the West Gresham Elementary building and repurpose it to benefit the community at no cost to taxpayers?

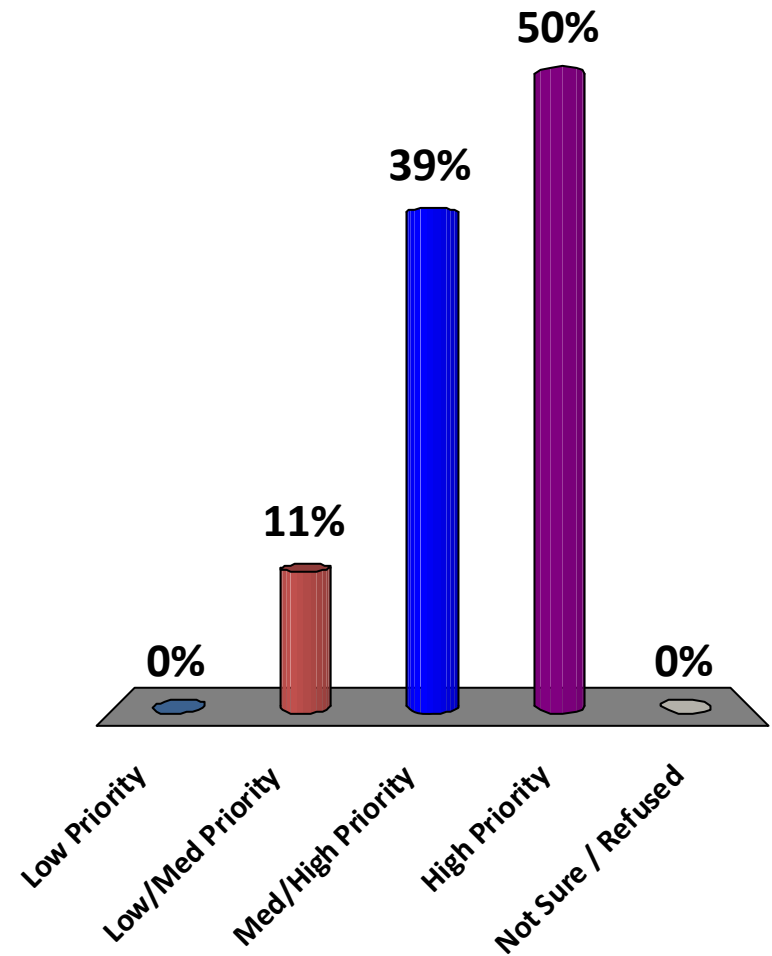

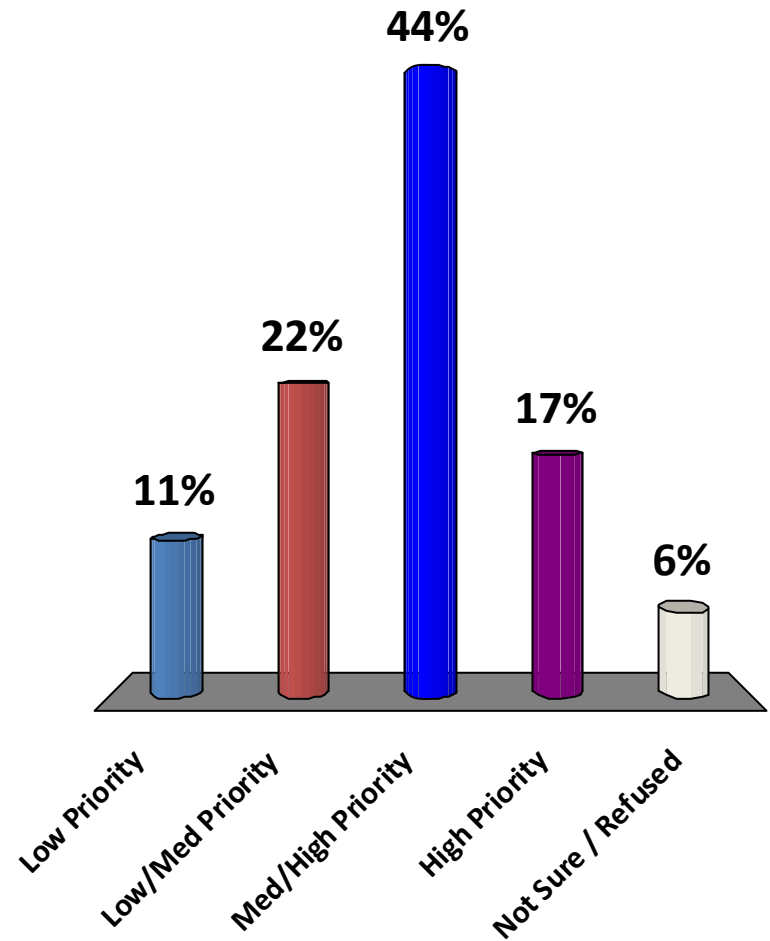

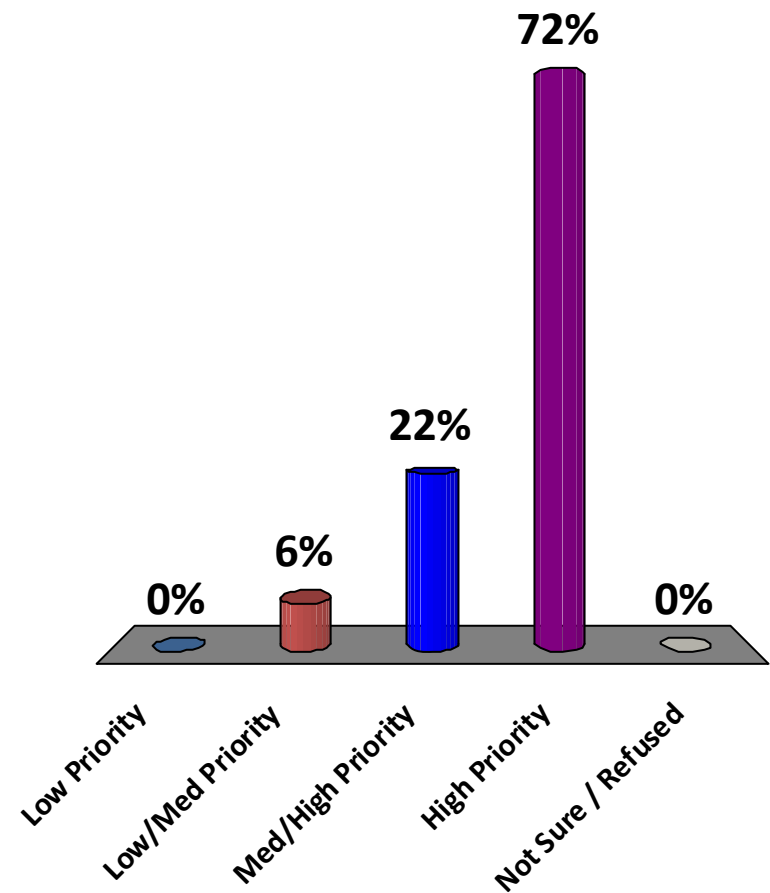

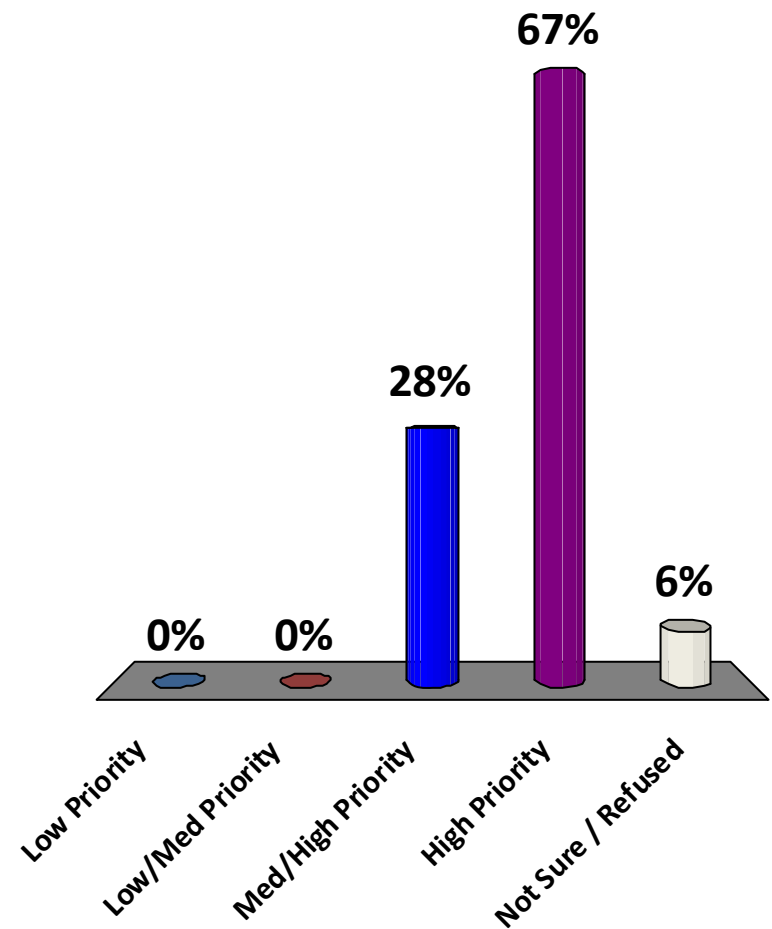

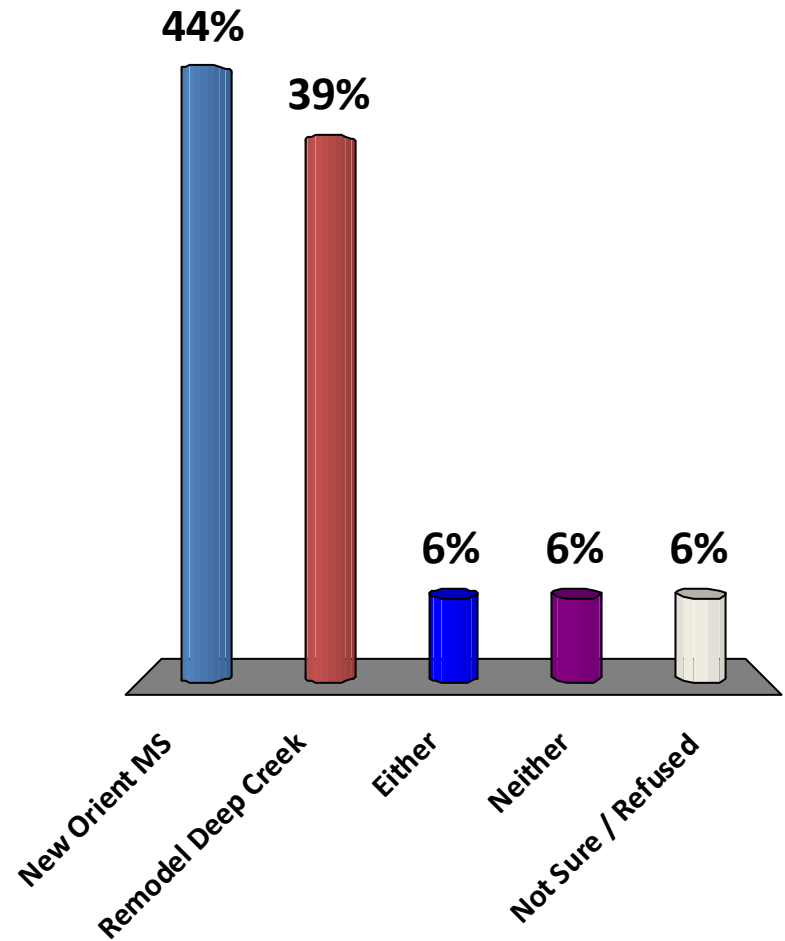

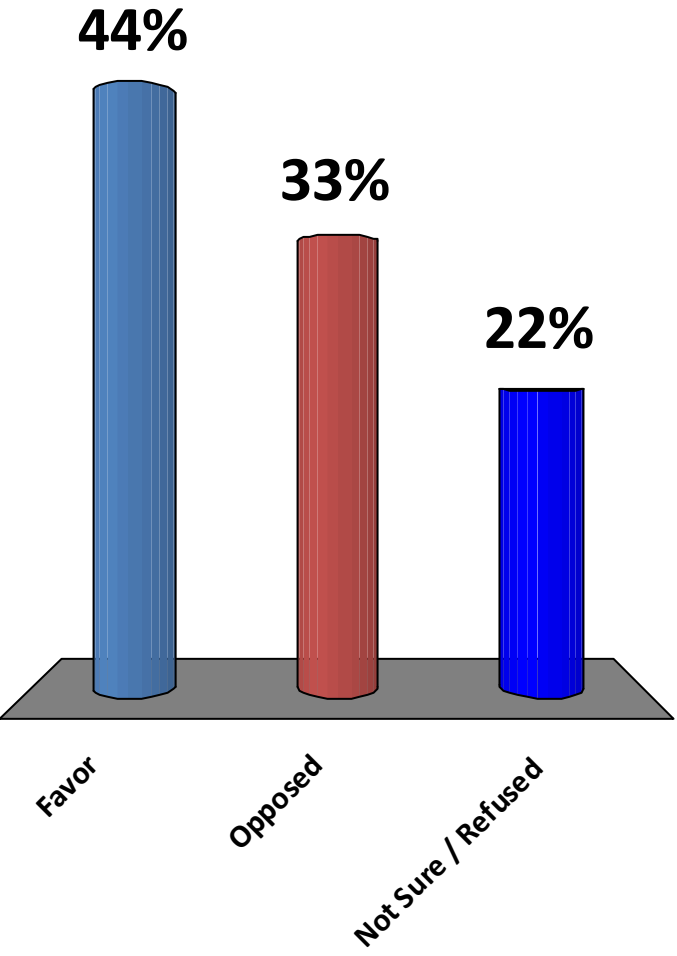

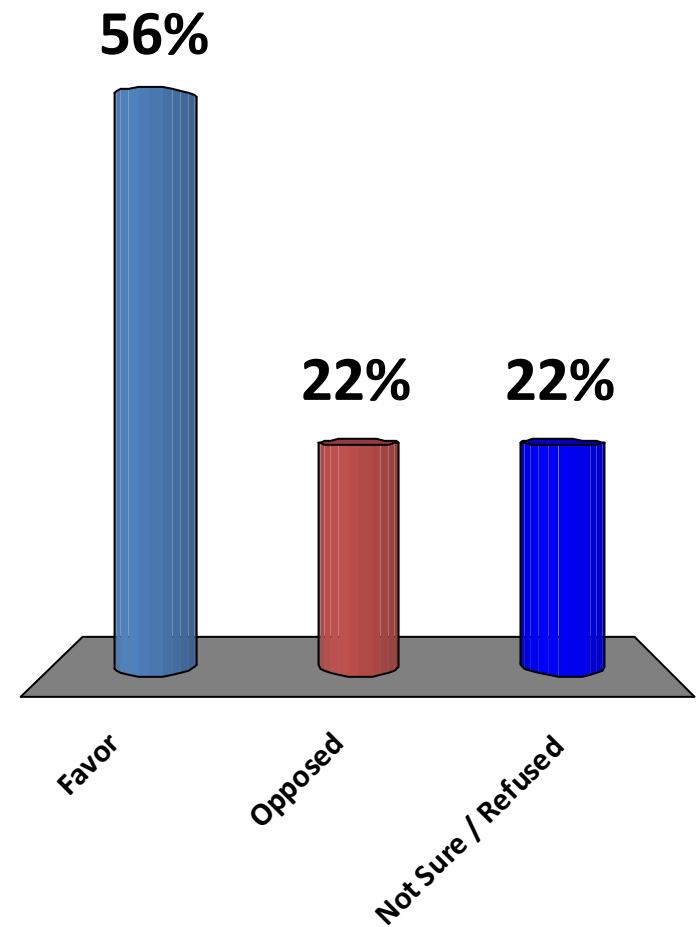

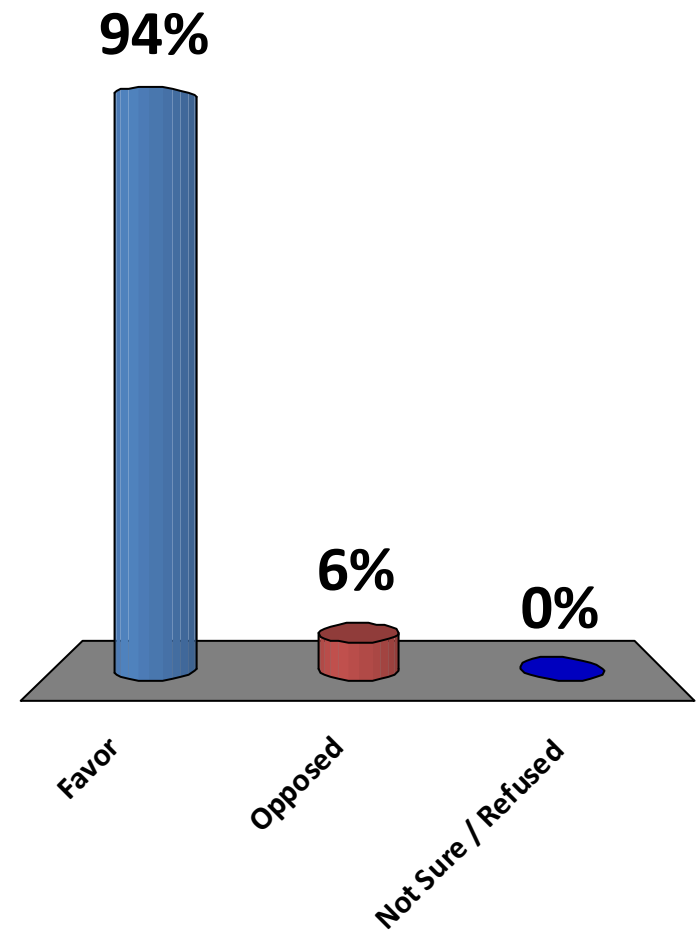

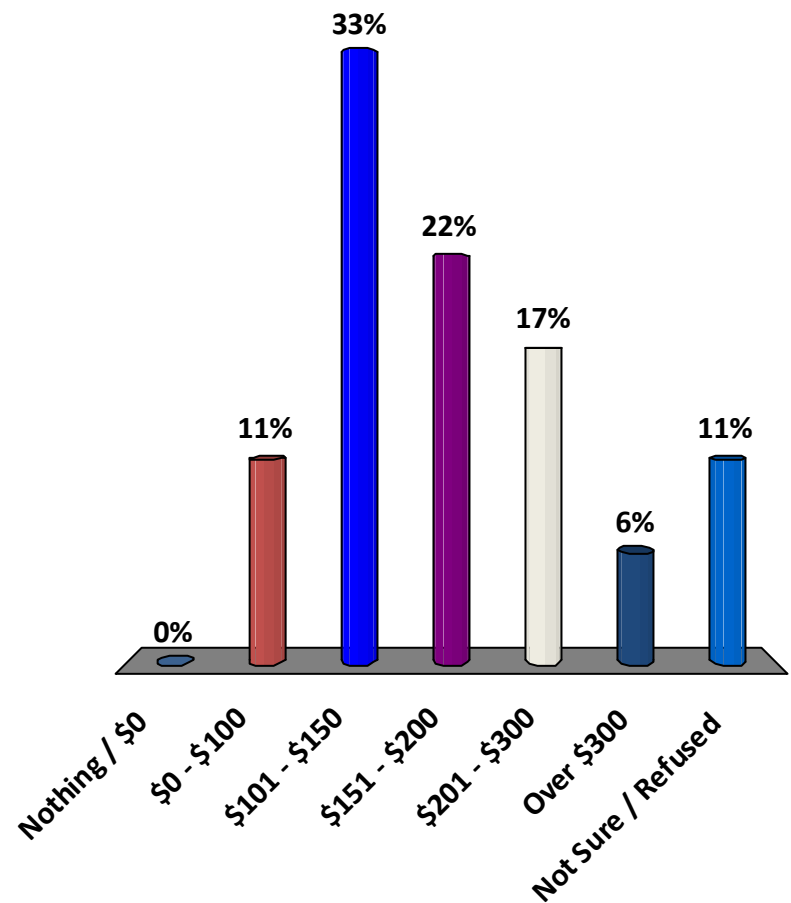

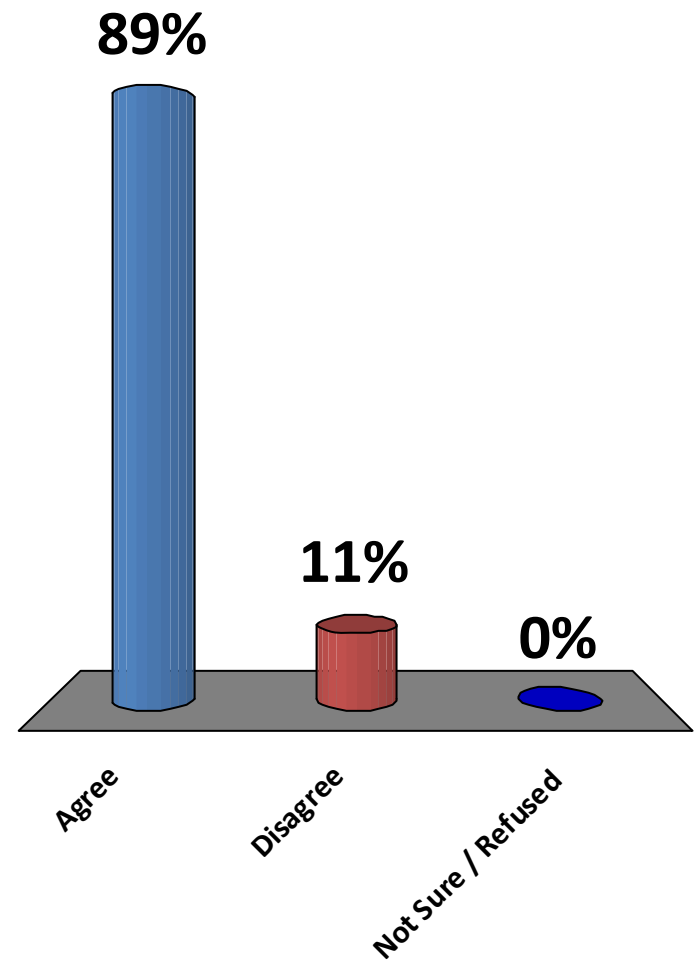

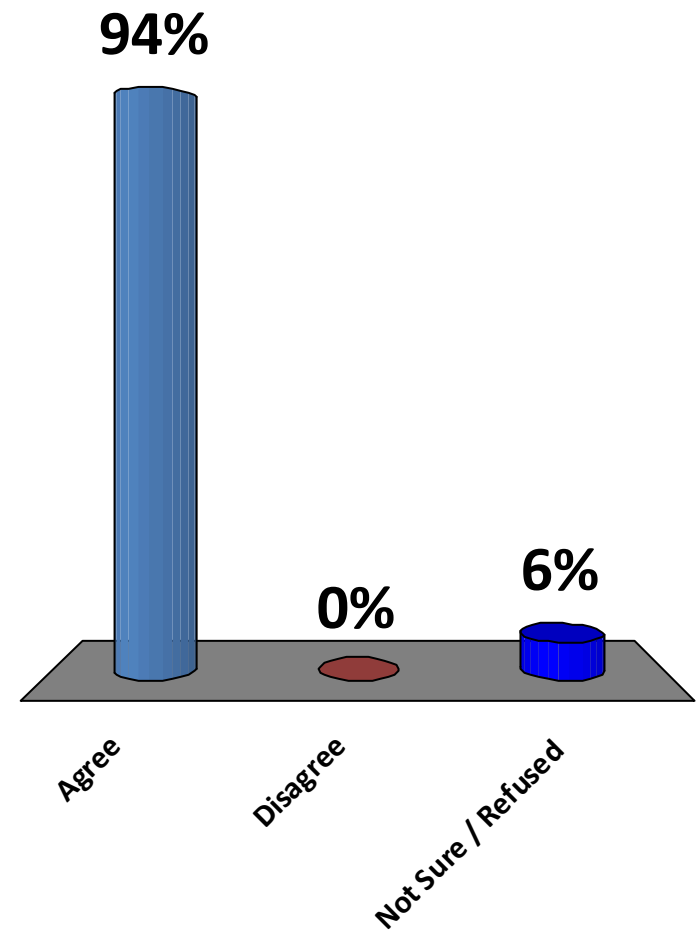


22. We need to protect the community's large investment in school facilities. I would favor a bond measure that includes repairs and maintenance at all of the district's buildings.

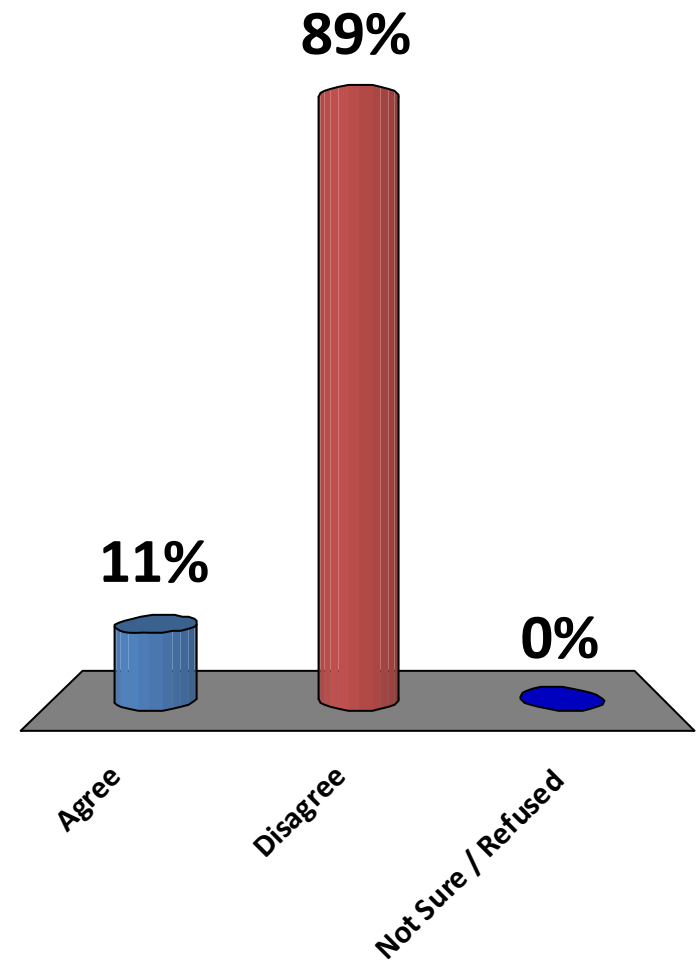

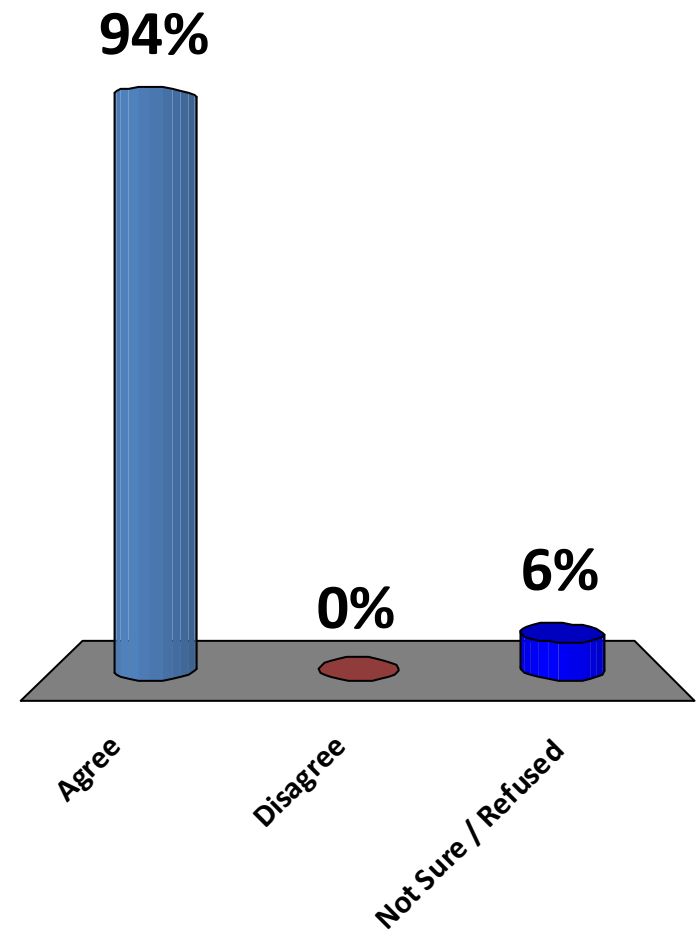


26. Ensuring the safety and security of our students is more important than ever. I would support a bond measure that includes seismic upgrades, automatic door locks and security systems throughout the district.

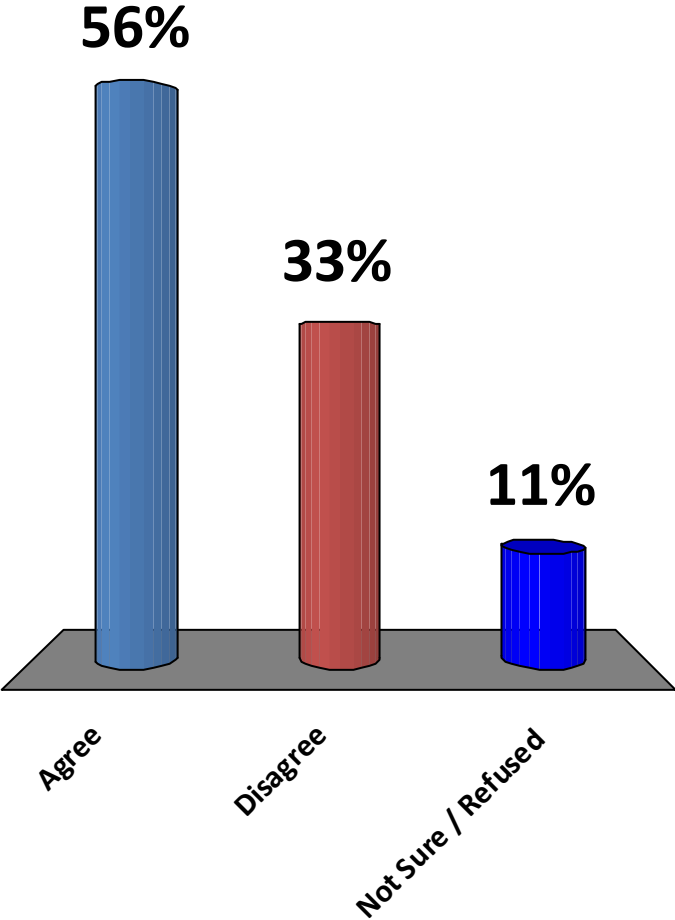
