From the Principal

Perhaps the most interesting month of the year is May as it consistently presents both beginnings and endings. We see new beginnings with trees leafing out, flowers blooming, and spring in full force. In May, we see the end of winter's grip and welcome spring.

A great example of May "beginnings and endings" comes with the Associated Student Body (ASB) election process. Students campaign in the hopes of earning an elected office to serve as leaders of our school. While this is the beginning for the newly elected officers, the existing leaders see their experience coming to an end with the hopes that they made an impact on the school environment.

Another classic example is the forecasting process and creating a class schedule for the next school year. Students begin to see themselves as a sophomore, a junior, or a senior while dreaming of that special class they finally get to take. In this case, we are ending one year by planning for the next; beginnings and endings.

Perhaps the best example of this concept is graduation. As parents, we begin to think about when our kids were in kindergarten, when they joined their first sports team, or played an instrument with the school band for the first time, or had their first heartbreak. We are also thinking about all of the opportunities that lie in front of them as they finish high school. Going to school or work, meeting that special someone, or finding a career. You see as parents, graduation is the end of childhood and the beginning of adulthood. While graduation may signify an end, it is also a grand entrance to so many amazing beginnings. Enjoy this time!

TEXTBOOKS DUE

All textbooks are due back to the Textbook Department, TMC, by the last day of school, June 23. After that date, if books are not returned, they will be marked as lost and each student will be responsible for the cost. If you are not sure what books are on your account, please stop by the TMC for a printout. Students must return their textbooks before they leave for the summer. Senior Clearance

The last day of school for seniors is Wednesday, June 7.

All seniors will need to pick up a **Senior Clearance Form** in the Student Management office June 5 and June 6. They will need to follow the instructions printed on the forms; this will include the return of all library, AV and textbook materials, a locker check, pick up portfolio in testing center and a final stop at the bookkeeper's window to pay all fees/fines due (if any), or to receive any deposit money owed to them. Seniors need to make sure that all past debts have been paid, and that all athletic gear has been turned in. If the student does not owe money to the school and has paid a security deposit, that money will be refunded to the student in cash during the Senior Clearance process. Statements of the students' accounts will be sent home the beginning of May. If there is a balance owed, checks will NOT be accepted after May 12, 2017. Only cash will be accepted by the bookkeeper.

Graduates who do not complete the final clearance process by the end of the school day on **June 7** will have their diplomas held by the bookkeeper and will not receive their graduation tickets. They will need to return to school to complete this process during regular business hours.

Commencement Tickets: Distribution of commencement tickets begins on Monday, June 5 and Tuesday, June 6 from the bookkeeper once clearance has been completed. Each senior will receive **10** tickets. Those seniors who do not need all 10 tickets should return extra tickets to the Student Management office. Any senior parent who needs more than 10 tickets must submit a **written request** to Teresa Juden, including a reason why there is a need and the number of additional tickets wanted during May 22-26. **We will not accept extra ticket requests by phone. There is no guarantee that a student will receive the amount of extra tickets requested.** The tickets will be divided as evenly as possible after all requests are received on May 12. Parents who request extra tickets will receive those tickets when your student does final checkout June 5 and 6 in a ticket envelope with the original 10.

Please keep in mind that we will only be using a portion of the Coliseum arena for seating; we encourage families to set realistic limits on the number of guests invited to commencement.

Seniors and Senior Parents: The final Senior Newsletter will be posted on the Barlow website under the graduation link.

Evening of Excellence:

Also, if you have signed up to serve in the military after high school, please let Mrs. Neuenschwander know. How about athletic commitments? This information is important for the **Evening of Excellence** and for **Commencement**. We want to make sure you are recognized for your achievements!

Students should continue stopping by the College & Career Center regularly to check for new scholarships. There are also computers available for researching colleges and scholarships. Even if you don't think you can get financial aid, you can win scholarship money. Remember, ASPIRE advisors are available during the lunch hour (11:30- 1:30) to help students with resumes, research, proofing essays and answering questions.

Seniors: *The College Placement Test* for Mt. Hood Community College will be held in the Computer Lab on Tuesday, May 16th after school. Please sign up with Mrs. Neuenschwander in the College & Career Center! You will need to have enrolled and been accepted at MHCC in order to take the placement test. You will need your birth date and MHCC student ID# to sign up. Please report whether you are a College Now student or CAL student, too. You may not be required to test if so. MHCC is also requiring our students to participate in a Placement Test Prep Session on Monday, May 9 at 2:30 in the library.

Sophomores & Juniors: *Don't know what to do during the summer break?* Check out your summer options in the College & Career Center – There are many places you can visit and colleges to be researched. A lot have summer specific programs! Come learn how to schedule a college visit over the summer. Taking a tour of a college campus is always the first step to deciding where you should spend the four years learning.

The test will be held at SBHS starting 7:30am. **Please note: this test is given 1 time per year, nationwide.** This will be the only opportunity for your student to take this test at Barlow High School for the 2017-18 school year. The state of Oregon will allow sophomores to take the test for free. Juniors must pay a fee to take the PSAT. Prices will be announced in the fall. Juniors are urged to participate in the PSAT as this is the qualifier for the National Merit Scholarship. Watch for registration (through the bookkeeper) in late September.

If you are unable to sign up for the Registration Night at MHCC on May 2, you will have another chance on Wed., June 14th. (The day after graduation.)
