SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Springwater Trail High School, accredited by the AdvancED Accreditation Commission, is one of three high schools in the Gresham-Barlow School District #10JT. Gresham is located 12 miles east of Portland, Oregon and includes both suburban and rural areas. STHS is a magnet school catering to students interested in middle college, small learning communities, authentic learning opportunities, and career-focused education. Students choosing STHS benefit from smaller class sizes in a more personal learning environment. Springwater Trail attendance area includes the entire Gresham-Barlow School District boundary and enrollment is by application only. The district attendance area has a population of over 100,000, serving more than 11,800 students across 18 schools. Springwater Trail High School has an annual enrollment of approximately 192 students and graduates an average of 46 students each year. Approximately 51% of our students receive Free & Reduced Lunch.

Civic engagement and scholastic excellence have been the pursuit of Springwater Trail High School. A highly qualified faculty teaches a rigorous academic program focusing on the application of classroom skills to the real world.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Gresham-Barlow School District diploma requires the following 24 credits for graduation:

4 credits English	3 credits Mathematics (Integrated 1 & higher)
3 credits Science	2 credits Health/Physical Education
3 credits Social Science	6 credits Electives
3 credits Fine Arts/CTE/World Language	

GRADING SYSTEM

Springwater Trail High School operates on a semester system with seven 50-minute classes per day. The school year runs approximately 36 weeks. One half-credit represents the achievement of one semester, totaling 18 weeks. Class rank is based on all subjects taken for a letter grade without weighting. Middle College credit earned at Mount Hood Community College is converted to high school credits and averaged with all other qualified course credit. All students enrolled in the class are considered when determining class rank. GPA selects our Valedictorian/Salutatorian.

POST-SECONDARY

Counseling and school faculty work with students throughout their four years to develop and implement a personal education plan that focuses on post-secondary success. 77% of graduates plan to attend 2- and 4-year colleges and universities; 7% plan to attend trade schools, apprenticeship programs, and/or vocational programs; 2% will utilize their career pathway certificate through our middle college program and immediately go into a welding career; and 2% will be joining our armed forces.
