LOCKER CLEANOUT Thursday, May 7th

We have finalized plans for students to pick up belongings from school. Locker contents have been removed and bagged and are labeled with the student's name. If they had a PE locker, those contents have also been removed and combined with their main locker contents in the labeled bag.

There will be a 6 hour window of time to pick up your items 12:00-2:00 (6th grade preferred) 2:00-4:00 (7th grade preferred) 4:00-6:00 (8th grade preferred). This is to help manage the number of students in the building at one time. If you cannot come during your grade level window, please come at a time that works for you and your family. The times are suggested and we will work with families to support their needs. *If you do not want your locker items returned to you, please call 503-667-6900 so we can make arrangements to donate or dispose of them.*

Only one member of the family will be allowed to enter the school and collect the belongings. Please enter through the front door. The floor will be marked at 6 foot distances and social distancing will be enforced. We will be collecting library books, text books, choir robes, athletic jersey etc. in the Commons, please look for the labeled bins to place items. In the gym you will give the student's last name and a staff member will retrieve a bag of their belongings. Please exit from

the main gym only. Review the attached map for more details about the route.

Families will be allowed to collect the belongings of all of their children, at one time, even if they are in different grade levels.

If your child has medication that needs to be picked up, please stop in the front office as you enter the building.

Every effort has been made to reduce touchpoints and unnecessary contact with others. Thank you for your patience and we appreciate your flexibility.

FAQ FOR PARENTS

When will my student receive technology?

How does my student get assignments from their teacher?

DISTANCE LEARNING FOR ALL

Expectations:

- Teachers will send out lessons and information each school day by 9:00 am in the morning or earlier.
- Students are *required* to complete all lessons and assignments each week for all classes.
- Wednesdays will be reserved for teachers to plan, prepare, receive professional development, and meet with colleagues to further develop their plans to cover content standards, but students will still have an activity sent to them by 9:00am or earlier.
- For middle school, "Instructional Hours" will be from 1:00 pm-4:00 pm during the 4 instructional days (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday). This will be a time when teachers may hold optional "real-time" check-ins with students, small groups, or whole classes via Google Hangouts/Meet, provide feedback on student work, hold tutorial sessions or post instructional videos.
- This does not mean that your child has to complete the work during this window of time, they will have the flexibility to complete work as it is convenient for them, and materials from "Instructional Hours" will be available to students through the Google Classroom pages 24-hours a day. You should expect your student to work about 3 hours each day.
- "Office Hours" will take place every day (including Wednesday) between 10:00 am-12:00 pm. This is guaranteed time that teachers will be available to connect with students and parents about the assignments for the week.
- Teachers will use the instructional hours not to meet as a whole class by period, but to address individual and small group needs as they arise.
- There will be lessons and assignments delivered on Wednesday. This is still a school day for students.
- Attendance is currently being tracked by completion of activities and assignments, not by attending virtual meetings.
