## COUNSELOR INFORMATION

To help you all contact the counselor who works with your students please read the following information. Ms. Dixon works with 6th grade Explorers and 7th grade and Mrs. Johnson works with 6th grade West Wing and 8th grade. Thanks for contacting the right person to get the best support for your student.

## CELL PHONE POLICY

**Students may not make or receive calls (or text messages) on a cell phone during the school day.** Prior to entering the school, or once the 3:35 p.m. bell rings, cell phone use is permitted. All devices are to be **stored securely in their locker** during the school day. If a cell phone is used (including texting) by a student, heard ringing, or is visible during the school day, the cell phone or other electronic device will be confiscated.

**1st Offense** - Student pick up a the end of the day in the office

**2<sup>nd</sup> Offense** - Parent pick up in the office

**3<sup>rd</sup> Offense** - Parent/Student meeting with administration

Failure to follow cell phone policy may result in the student not being able to bring a cell phone to school. Again, the possession of any valuable item is discouraged, and the risk of loss or theft is entirely the responsibility of the student..

## AFTER SCHOOL ATHLETIC SPECTATOR EXPECTATIONS

We are pleased with the parent and student support provided at our after-school games. When it comes to maintaining a game environment that is supportive of athletes and comfortable for all spectators, there are a few guidelines that Russell students should keep in mind.

While attending an athletic event, student spectators need to respect the other spectators attending the event. Movement in and out of the gymnasiums should be restricted to quarter, half, and between game breaks. The doors leading to the hallway are the only doors available for entry and exit. DO NOT use the doors that lead to the football field. These are emergency exits only.

Students attending after school events are expected to be spectators in the stands. Students are not to be roaming around the hallway or areas outside of the gymnasium. These areas, including the covered play area, are off-limits to student activities during our games. Skateboarding and riding bicycles are also prohibited in these areas when after school events are taking place.

Again, we appreciate student spectators at our after-school athletic events. We expect our spectators to behave in a manner respectful of athletes and other spectators. Students and spectators unable to follow our guidelines will be removed from the event and restricted from after-school activities.
